Paul Docherty writes:

A few weeks ago, Biddy Mayo, the Chief Officer at Citizens Advice Fareham or one of her colleagues, spoke at all the Sunday Masses in the Roman Catholic parish to thank parishioners for their contributions to the Christians Together in Fareham Covid Emergency Fund. Biddy realised that the fund was a joint effort but, realistically, she and her team can't visit all the churches involved to say an individual thank you, so I offered to circulate her notes which, as well as saying a huge thank you to all the churches, explain how the fund has been used.

Biddy's talk – slightly paraphrased ...

"Thank you for contributing to the Christians Together Covid Emergency Fund which raised £21,000 from several churches to help people in Fareham stay in their homes. Every penny raised went directly to the clients. We at Citizens Advice, Fareham helped over 493 clients with housing issues last year, many of whom would now be homeless without access to the funds we received from the Christians Together fund.

To give you an idea of how the fund has been used, the money has helped to pay for:

- Rent arrears where clients had hit a short-term emergency but were able to manage their full rent going forwards.
- Bankruptcy application fees for clients in serious financial difficulties. These fees can be more than £690 per person.
- Application fees for debt relief orders which cost £90 per application. One off-debts of elderly people in financial hardship.

Citizens Advice is really grateful for the close working relationship we have developed with Christians Together in Fareham and hope that we will continue to receive your support as we look for ways to fund the service going forward and so that we can help the community of Fareham."

The Christians Together Covid Emergency Fund originated in our parish as the Covid Emergency Fund, organised by Richard Healey, before being launched to the rest of CTiF.

### Little Fishes

On 6th March, Little Fishes made cards, flowers and pictures for their Mummies and others who care for them. They enjoyed turning their handprints into plants and we sung a special song during our praise time to say thank you to our Mummies.





There were lots of 'good luck' shamrocks made in Little Fishes on Wednesday 13th March as they heard about Saint Patrick ready for his feast day on 17th March. Potato printing is certainly a messy favourite! We talked about how Saint Patrick used the shamrock to explain about the Trinity.



On 20th March, Little Fishes made their own palm leaves and donkeys as they found out about Palm Sunday. They used them to wave during their Praisetime as they sang 'Sing Hosanna'.







The Easter fun continued for Little Fishes at their session during the holidays. On 3rd April we welcomed our usual Little fishes attendees plus their older siblings who all seemed to enjoy completing some Eastery crafts. They made Easter basket pictures, Easter gardens, Easter egg scratch arts and a collage of the empty Easter tomb. A big thank you to the helpers who enabled us to run during the holidays.



Little fishes welcomed in the spring on the 10th April, their second week of the Easter holidays. Children made birds in their nests, fluffy lambs made of cotton wool and the older children made chicks, rabbits and lambs from foam kits. During Praisetime, children looked at the buds which are appearing on the plants; they will soon come alive again with colour. We encouraged everyone to go on a spring walk using all their senses to spot signs of spring.







#### World Day of Prayer

On 1st March, our parish hosted the World Day of Prayer for Christians Together in Fareham. The service had been prepared over a year ago by Christian women in Palestine so it was particularly poignant given the current conflict. We set up prayer stations to show some aspects of Palestine including the relevance of olive trees where the trunk, branches and leaves symbolise three generations of a family.

Once again at our MU meeting we were given an insight into life in another country. This time our speaker, Mrs Rachel Hicks, transported us from a dull March afternoon in Fareham to the bustling city of Mumbai (Bombay) in India.

Rachel was only a baby when her parents moved to Mumbai so that her father could to take up a teaching post at a boys' school there. The family had a flat within the school compound and they soon became very much part of the local community. Rachel told us about her life, growing up in a multi-cultural, multi-faith society. She introduced us to the sights, sounds and colour of life in this lively city. Since there are Hindus, Muslims, Sikhs and Parsees as well as Christians living there, it seemed to Rachel that there were always festivals being celebrated with music, dancing and fireworks the order of the day.

As she was only a child, Rachel accepted the poverty that was all around them. She said that there were always beggars, many of whom were children, forced to beg by adults who then took any money the children were given. When going out, Rachel's parents carried nourishing biscuits to give to such children rather than giving them money and there was always a hot meal ready for anyone who came knocking at the door of their flat.

As Rachel described her life in India, it was obvious that it was a very happy time for her but, when she was 11, her parents decided to come home so that she could continue her education in England. Hers was a very different childhood to the one most of us have known, but it has given Rachel a very tolerant and outgoing attitude to life and people.



The St Columba School's Easter Service went well with a good number of parents, grandparents and carers attending. The children are getting used to the microphones and sang really well. Unfortunately we didn't have many parents stay for refreshments but we are going to carry on offering refreshments after school services.






